TRANSFER CREDITS

At the discretion of the program director, no more than two courses (six semester hours) may be transferred into the Master in TESOL program. In order for a course to transfer in to the program, the grade in the course must be 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 point scale and the goals, outcomes and assessment results must be similar to that of the Master in TESOL course being fulfilled through transfer credit.



PROGRAM ADMISSION

Student must submit all application credentials in order to be considered for the program. Students may enroll in an initial Master in TESOL course before being accepted into the program, but they must submit their completed application materials before finishing the course in order to be formally admitted to the Master in TESOL program.
