Do yoga, exercise.

But it's also good to be a team player, to be collaborative, to play well with others.
And to pay your dues.
Tennis player Stan Smith was asked how he won Wimbledon.
And he said, "A game at a time."

Don't be afraid to bomb. To fail. TAKE CHANCES!

Those bad situations make you faster, better, stronger.

HERE'S MY FAVORITE BOMBING STORY

I did a big conference. 1500 people.

A New Year's Eve show in Charleston, SC ten years ago.

I said how I love the TV show "24".

Very popular back then. With Kiefer Sutherland.

I loved Chloe, I identified with her. She was a geeky girl, too.

I said, "I think Chloe should be married to Jack (Kiefer, the star).

I know she's married to Morris.

But what if something were to happen to Morris?"

Well, there were crickets. You could have driven a truck though the silence.

I said, "Oh I guess you don't watch the show." And I moved on.

This man came up to the stage afterwards and said, "I really like 24."

I said, "Sir, I think it's you, me, your wife and my son."

And he said, "Well, I'm the Executive Producer."

Sometimes I get nothing out of it. But I still give and you know why.

Because GIVING FEELS GOOD.

I think it releases endorphins, just the way laughter does.

Be generous. Tip the waitress. Tip the bartender.

Write thank you notes.

I became a comedian late in life.

My husband calls America the "Land of Second Chances." The truth is that America is the land of 2nd, 3rd and 4th chances.) I was 37 years old before I found out what I wanted to do in life. Most of you are around 22. You have 15 years to find what you want to do. So I'm pretty sure you can beat my timeline..

Which leads me to the big question, for women and men, **WHAT ABOUT KIDS?** Best thing I ever did. Hardest thing I ever did. My goal was to be a vice-president of something before I had kids. Didn't work out.

I had the kids, but THEY became MY MATERIAL! I like to say in my act: "I have two boys. Otherwise everything's fine."

"So much I don't know about boys. Like why would anybody want to blow their nose into a boarding pass. Why?" And parents? I know how you feel. It's tough being a parent.

You ever notice how you always worry about the other kid being the bad influence on your kid. It's always the OTHER kid.

Then it turns out that YOUR kid is THAT kid.

YOUR kid is the biter or the bully or the keg distributor for North America."

The kids have all these dating apps like Tindr, Bumble, OkCupid. I'd like someone to come up with some dating apps for older people like, "I can drive at night." Or "I bought my burial plot and there's room for you."
